The Board of Education of the LakeVille Community School District is conducting a comprehensive search for its next Superintendent. The expected start date for the new Superintendent is July 1, 2024.

The LakeVille Community School District encompasses portions of eastern Genesee County and western Lapeer County, between the cities Flint and Lapeer. The location offers convenient access to major manufacturing centers, post-secondary education facilities, health care, shopping, entertainment and more.

As its "LakeVille" name implies; lakes, open spaces, and natural beauty abound in the district. Families call LakeVille home generation after generation. The family atmosphere and small-town settings make LakeVille a very desirable place to live. Residents of the district take ownership of the schools and demonstrate their support through their voluntary involvement in school activities and support of recent ballot proposals.

Falcon Pride is more than a slogan throughout the LakeVille area. The school district binds and connects Otisville, Otter Lake, Columbiaville and the surrounding areas together. The LakeVille Community School District unites every community within the district boundaries into---**LakeVille**.

LakeVille Community School District's 1,096 students are educated in three school buildings. Students in grades kindergarten through fourth grades attend Columbiaville Elementary. Students in fifth through eighth grade attend LakeVille Middle School and students in ninth through twelfth grade attend LakeVille Memorial High School on the same campus in Otisville. The District employs 155 staff members, including 58 teachers, 5 counselors, 6 administrative staff members, 53 support staff members, 9 office staff, and 24 paraprofessionals. It has an annual operating budget of \$14.7 million, with a foundation allowance of \$9,608 per pupil and a fund balance projected at 18% of revenues.
